HOSPITAL CORPS COMMITTEE.

HEADQUARTERS:

HOTEL CADILLAC,

CORNER ROWLAND STREET AND MICHIGAN AVENUE,

Where the Committee will be pleased to see all of the visiting Surgeons.

Field Hospitals will be established at the Headquarters, Cadillac Building, the Market Building, Grand Circus Park, Belle Isle Park and the Exposition Grounds, equipped with necessary appliances and attended by Members of the Committee, Orderlies and trained Nurses (from Grace and Harper Hospitals).

In two of these, provision will be made for women.

Besides these, the established Hospitals of the City—St. Mary's Hospital, Marine Hospital, Harper Hospital, Grace Hospital, Emergency Hospital, and St. Luke's Hospital—will be open for the reception of the sick or injured.

Twenty-eight Medical Relief Stations will be located upon the principal streets in various parts of the city, with a competent Physician in attendance at all times. These will be designated by the Red Cross (Hospital) flag.

Nine fully equipped ambulances will be in readiness for service at all times.

Nine Latrines, also Medical Relief Stations, will be located at street corners along the line of march.

A medical man will accompany each excursion from the city, to render assistance in case of injury or illness.

THE GRAND PARADE.

The Grand Parade will take place on Tuesday, August 4th, 1891. The head of the column will move at 10.30 o'clock A. M. from the corner of Woodward and Adams Avenues, and proceed over the following route, viz.: Woodward Avenue to Park, Park to Washington, Washington to Michigan, Michigan to Shelby, Shelby to Lafayette, Lafayette to Fourth, Fourth to Fort, Fort to Griswold, Griswold to south side of Jefferson, Jefferson to Dequindre; countermarch north side Jefferson to Woodward, up Woodward, passing under the Arch corner Park and Woodward, when parade will be dismissed. Comrades breaking ranks to the right so as not to interfere with marching column. The Reviewing Stand will be located on Campus Martius, east side of Woodward Avenue.

The escort of the Commander-in-Chief will be Detroit Post, 384, of the Department of Michigan.
